<u>Maths</u>

Our Maths will build on the comparison work from last week and we will be comparing 2 and then 3 numbers. Then they will be considering the order numbers are in and placing them on a number line and making our own. The children will be using the vocabulary: 'greatest' and 'smallest' to discuss the value of the numbers they are comparing.

English

Our text this week for Guided reading and the focus for our writing will be: Squishy McFluff: Tea with the Queen. We too will be thinking about a way to get into the palace! What will be better... a clear labelled plan? Or a set of written instructions? What obstacles might be in our way? How will we solve the problems we may encounter?

This week's fluency poem is called The Nut Tree by Julia Donaldson. Our focus will be expression.

Phonics

Next week we will be leaning alternative digraphs for sounds we have already learnt: ay (ai), ou (ow), oy (oi), ea (ee). We will also be reading and writing the tricky words: said, says, you, do, like, little, push, pull, full, put. Please look out for the new digraphs and tricky words when sharing reading books at home and log it Boom Reader. Remember your child can change their reading book as often as you/they would like. If they have it in their hand when they come into class in the morning it serves as a good reminder. We will also do a whole class reminder every Friday.

<u>Topic</u>

Following on from learning about the human and physical features of Stoneleigh, we will now start looking at the key landmarks of London. If your child has been to London, it would be great if you could refresh their memory about what you did and what you saw to help with discussions in school.

To aid our science learning about seasonal changes each class will be adopting a different tree in our school grounds. We will initially compare what each tree looks like and then monitor how they change throughout the seasons.

In PSHE we will be considering feelings. In RE we will be continuing our learning about Christianity and considering the questions: I wonder how Christians can share God's creation? And I wonder what you are thankful for? In art we will be looking at abstract art, focusing on exploring colours and shapes and creating our own pictures.

<u>PE</u>

The children will continue to be thinking about fitness and developing ball skills within their PE lessons. They will be developing their understanding of how exercise helps our brain.

<u>Homework</u>

Every time you have read with your child, please log it on Boom Reader. Your child can change their book as often as you'd like them to. If they have their book out of their bag when they walk into the classroom we can help to remind them to swap it for a different one.

If you are out and about this weekend and can collect some acorns/pine cones/conkers for our maths area, that would be fantastic! Please add them in the box outside the classroom door next week.

The children will have a new phonics sheet. These sheets will revise the content taught the previous week and are to help your child consolidate their phoneme knowledge.
